
Celebrating Women in the Construction Industry

LYNN KRAMER

PROCON is an 84-year-old privately-owned design-build firm that values the contributions of women in a male-dominated industry. One of their strong women contributors is Project Executive Lynn Kramer, who has carved out a long, successful career in the field.

The best advice Lynn Kramer ever got in the business was "Never give up!" With over 30 years in construction, those words have served her well. Lynn graduated from Penn State University with a civil engineering degree, but knew by age 10 what she aspired to. She reflected "I never wanted to do anything but construction."

After college, she landed a job working for Whiting-Turner as a Project Engineer and worked her way up to a Project Manager (PM). "It was a proving ground, so I learned my craft well and worked very hard" She reflected.



Her passion for the industry was evident as she revealed, "My favorite part of construction is building relationships with owners and subcontractors." Additionally, she enjoys mentoring, which she sees as a foundational component of her leadership role as a Project Executive. Currently, Lynn has a large team of PMs divided across the six commercial projects she is overseeing, which are in various phases of construction. Lynn commented, "I offer them guidance while recognizing that each individual has their own working style. I work closely with my teams to ensure we are leaving a job having learned something new and are continuously improving."

Her advice to women entering the field was, "It's up to you to blaze your own trail. Be confident, be tenacious, speak up, and treat every obstacle as an opportunity to learn and deliver an exceptional project."



MICHELLE DELOIS

or over 40 years Denron Plumbing and HVAC has been dedicated to providing top-quality installations and complete customer satisfaction in every project and application. The company places a lot of value on its people being leaders within everything they do. One of their lead team members is Chief Financial Officer Michelle DeLois.

Michelle is a CPA and has a background in public accounting. She spent many years preparing financial statements and audits of small and mid-size general contractors. Michelle shared that she "felt it was rewarding to have helped so many construction companies and at the same time it developed into a niche profession." As the accounting industry changed to involve less face to face interaction with clients, Michelle found that she wanted to be "somewhere I could apply my niche experience in new ways to make a difference."



That opportunity came when she joined Denron. Michelle's confidence in her work is evident as she described her role as CFO at Denron, "I saw an opportunity to improve how we do business here. I work with our leadership team to think in new ways how we can bid jobs successfully. In some ways I changed the role the CFO plays in our business."

During her time at Denron, Michelle has been a champion of creating new processes and systems that have had positive impacts on the way people communicate and make decisions within the company.

Seek out education to become a knowledge leader in an area of interest you have and be confident in what you are saying, that empowers you to become a leader."

ASHLEY LECLAIR (LORMAN)

Built in 1960, Methuen Construction Company is recognized as a highly successful, self-performing general contractor in the industry. Methuen Construction self-performs construction services using many highly skilled professionals including welders like Ashley LeClair.

Ashley did not start her career thinking she would be a construction welder. Instead she thought she would be a marine biologist, but her hobby of mud truck racing led to the need to learn how to weld and she attended the welding program at Manchester Community College. While there, Ashley fell in love with her work and became involved in SkillsUSA. Through that program, Methuen offered Ashley an opportunity in the field. For the last two years she has blossomed into a leader of her team.

There isn't a task or role that Ashley is afraid to learn and take on. She believes that "No matter what you do, you will always need to learn, so get into a program early. My advice to anyone is that if you are interested in doing something, then get into it as early as you can and never stop learning."

While at Methuen, Ashley's proven herself a real leader in the industry. She had a part managing operations for high-profile projects such as the Tappan Zee Bridge and the Boston MTA. What she likes most about construction is there are "always people there to help you learn to do something. It makes things much easier to get the job done when someone can help explain it and work with you as a team to get the work done." That sense of teamwork and being empowered to lead is what makes Ashley proud to be doing what she does.

Her advice for anyone looking to entire the industry is simple, "the construction field is a hard thing to get into. But with a good attitude and a willingness to learn, you will be able to get into a career without a problem. The best thing anyone can do is get involved as early as possible and don't hold back."

It's clear that Ashley is a leader among the next generation of women in the construction workforce.



Amelia is a carpenter at North Branch Construction. Having worked in the construction industry for 8 years, Amelia plays an immensely important role in construction as she is responsible for physically building North Branch's projects. Amelia's favorite thing about her job is being part of a crew; she enjoys how everyone works together as a team. She chose working in construction because she wanted a career where she could see tangible results of her efforts and accomplishments every day at work. She likes being able to drive by or walk around a building and know that she had a part in its creation.

Amelia is inspired by knowledgeable and seasoned carpenters at North Branch Construction who take the time to teach less-experienced employees how to do things in a safe and efficient way. When discussing challenges women can face working in construction, Amelia admits that

sometimes people underestimate her, but she tries to show them that she is there to get the job done just like they are. If she was to give one piece of advice to girls and young women interested in pursuing a career in construction, Amelia would say, "Be willing to work hard, be open to learning, have a good attitude, and you will be able to go far in construction. Show that you are capable, and you will earn respect."





KAREN PRINCE

M. Piper is a general contractor that has been committed to improving New Hampshire's infrastructure since their incorporation in 1982. The company values their small business nature, their safety minded operations and takes great pride in the quality of the work they perform. As one of the leading voices in the company, Karen Prince has spent her career striving to make this family business a great place to work.

For the last 25 years, Karen's role at R.M. Piper has continually expanded. What started out of an opportunity to fill a vacant entry-level position has evolved into a passion for the industry and the people that work in it. "If you are dependable and able to communicate, we will train you. If you can follow direction, we can teach you the skills necessary to advance in the industry. The opportunities are endless for a motivated person."

It is clear her passion for helping develop talent and create a positive working environment is a leading force that helped make R.M. Piper a successful New Hampshire company.

Four Important Changes to the AIA Contract that Owners Will Almost Always Accept

BY KENNETH E. RUBINSTEIN AND GREG SILVERMAN

Many contractors are hesitant to make changes to the standard AIA Contracts for fear that doing so will prompt the owner make their own aggressive changes, or that a lengthy process will ensue. While this is a legitimate concern, there are certain changes that most owners will readily accept without hesitation, and which make the contract significantly safer for contractors.

This article lays out several of these edits, and also offers a suggestion of how to present the changes in a manner that is likely to be accepted without issue.

Addition of "Order of Precedence" Clause

The AIA Documents generally include an "Enumeration of Documents" section, laying out the documents comprising the contract, but it does not identify which documents take priority in the event of a conflict. Accordingly, we recommend that contractors include an "Order of Precedence" section to avoid any question. An example of such language would be, "Any conflict between any of the Contract Documents shall be resolved in the order of precedence listed above, such that any document shall enjoy priority over any subsequently listed document." This avoids any

argument over which provision governs and gives clarity to the contractor of how to proceed if an issue is discovered in the course of construction.

Clarification of Commencement and Substantial Completion Date

The Main Contract (e.g., the AIA A101 or A102 incorporating the A201) includes a section where the parties can define the commencement date and duration for the construc-

by permitting, access, or late contract execution.

Modification of Notice Requirements

The language of the AIA A201 General Conditions requires that all Notices of Claims must be made "by certified or registered mail, or by courier providing proof of delivery." This language ignores the way that communications are typically conducted on a project. We recommend that this language be modified by

tion period. We recommend that contractors define commencement as "Seven days following the later of Owner's furnishing of (a) all necessary permits and access necessary to complete the Work and (b) the parties' execution of all applicable contract documents.' We then recommend that the Substantial Completion date be measured as a set number of calendar days from commencement, which is one of the options given in the contract, rather than use a calendar date for the deadline. These two changes together allow some breathing room at the beginning of the project, and avoids any conflict over delays caused

adding,", or by any reasonable method consistent with the parties' prior communication or where receipt can be reasonably confirmed." This change is consistent with the way that communications generally proceed on the project, and is important because notices that do not comply with the contract's requirements may be deemed invalid, and contractors may be held to have missed important deadlines as a result. Indeed, where possible, my preference is to change the contract's 21 day notice requirement to instead require notice "within a reasonable time," however,

some owners may object to that flexibility. At a minimum, we advocate to modify the form of the notice, as this ease of communications helps both parties.

Limitation of Liquidated Damages

Owners and contractors frequently agree that liquidated damages that will be assessed if the work is not completed on time. The AIA contract includes a placeholder to include such language, however, the AIA contract does not offer any recommended language to address. Accordingly, the parties will likely be editing that section of the contract anyway. We recommend that where contractors accept liquidated damages, there should be some limitation (typically 50-100%

of the contractor's fee or profit margin) to avoid the potential for unlimited liabilities that are disproportionate to the Contractor's potential benefit.

Of the four changes recommended in this article, this is the most likely to generate pushback as this change (unlike the other three) solely benefits the contractor, and not the owner; however, this may also be the most crucial in protecting contractors from potentially catastrophic risk. In any event, because the liquidated damages clause is already a modification to the standard contract, this is an area where change can be presented without necessarily inviting further scrutiny. Moreover, in our experience, many owners understand the contractor's hesitance to accept unlimited risk and are willing to accept reasonable limitations. The above modifications can be implemented as "redline" changes made in the contract itself, or by adding an "Addendum," which can be added as a Contract Document. Some clients prefer one option over the other, and you can select your approach based upon which option you feel will be most easily received by the owner.

In our experience, these changes (particularly items 1, 2 & 3 above) are nearly always accepted by Owners without hesitation. For complex or particularly high dollar projects, we recommend certain additional edits to the AIA documents, however, the changes identified here present an easy way for contractors to make important improvements to their contracts without inviting a costly, lengthy, or difficult negotiation process.

do something about it and has spearheaded the opening of an <u>ACE NH chapter</u>. ACE stands for (Architecture Construction Engineering), and it's a national high school mentoring program with a goal to ensure that the ACE industry has a next-generation workforce. We spoke with three of the A/C/E NH Board Members, Brian Knox, Stacy Clark, and Annette Carroll about its goal and influence on tomorrow's A/C/E professionals.

Josh Reap, President ABC NH/VT: Tell us about the ACE mentor program?

Brian: "High school students engage with industry professionals (mentors) to work on mock projects - taking them from concept to delivery. Consequently, students have the opportunity to compete regionally

So, I brought a group of people together to discuss the plan and got commitments from current board members to build this program."

JR: What is the goal?
Brian: "To spread the vision, and to make this amazing program available to high schools all over NH. To establish the program so it's available for many years to come."

Stacy: "We would like students to experience all aspects of the A/C/E industries and spark an interest in them so they want to pursue a career in these areas."

JR: What are your NH goals for ACE?

Stacy: "The short term goal is to have a successful initial 2018-2019 pilot program with Oyster River High School, then a full year program while slowly starting additional ones

Annette: "To build up our mentor pool so that the programs can compete against one another regionally and nation-

at other high schools."

grams can compete against one another regionally and nationally for scholarships. We need to get the younger generation interested and hope that this type of hands-on experience is the trick!"

JR: What has been the industry response to ACE NH so far?

Brian: "Excellent and very supportive! When I approached PROCON's Chairman and CEO, Mark Stebbins about re-starting a New Hampshire chapter, he immediately agreed. So far, some great companies have gotten on board with us such as Denron Plumbing & HVAC, Turnstone Corporation, Harvey Building Products, Pilot Construction, and Read & Associates. And many others have expressed their support for our program going forward."

Stacy: "Everyone believes in it and thinks it's great, now we need commitments from companies and individuals to help us be successful."

Annette: "ABC NH/VT has been especially supportive. Your organization allowed us to introduce ACE at the annual Excellence in Construction Awards gala last year. I think that everyone agrees there is a need for ACE."

JR: What have you been able to achieve so far?

Stacy: "We are currently working on the pilot program."

Brian: "We have presented our program to industry-specific organizations like yours (ABC NH/VT), as well as AIA-NH. We have also introduced it to many companies in the area."

Annette: "We've put together a board, partnered with multiple

high schools. State of NH Extended Learning Opportunities ("ELO's"), who are coordinators at multiple high schools and CTE coordinators, recruited mentors and sponsors, held open houses to get students interested, and put together a pilot program, schedule, and a curriculum."

JR: How does ACE benefit students?

Brian: "Students are exposed to the A/C/E disciplines, potential career paths, competitions, engagement with other statewide/regional/national high schools, and the first-hand knowledge and experience of industry professionals." Annette: "It helps students to figure out if the A/C/E fields are a career path that truly interests them. They can explore them before attending college and decide whether to spend money on something they may not end up doing. A/C/E makes scholarship funds available to students who choose to pursue A/C/E careers."

JR: Why does our industry need the ACE mentoring program?

Brian: "If we don't get young people involved in these fields now, the entire industry will pay the price 5, 10 and 15 years from now. It's going to take all of us recognizing the need and working together so that we all benefit in the long run."

JR: How can someone become involved with ACE as a mentor or sponsor?

Stacy: "Join a committee, be a mentor, or sponsor the program."
