Rewards for Skill Gains

- ABC NH/VT & NHHBA have set the minimum pay rates for the apprenticeship.
 - Starting wage: \$16 per hour
 - Ending wage: \$23 per hour
 - Two increases between starting and ending wage
- Employers can choose to go higher but cannot go lower

- Develop a recruitment strategy and plan with members of the ApprenticeshipNH Team.
 - Connect with high school students through pre-apprenticeship programs to train the next generation.
 - Connect with job seekers from state and community organizations.
- Opportunities are posted on the ApprenticeshipNH Website and Facebook Page.
- ApprenticeshipNH will host information sessions for potential apprentices.

Funding
