



Unfortunately, I fell back into my addiction a year after I started that job. For the next few years, I struggled. Then in 2020 I gave birth to my now one-year-old son. I moved to Nashua, where I found an amazing recovery community, where I began to work on my addiction for not only myself, but my son. During that year I enrolled in NHEP and was given the opportunity to work with some great people that helped me to see the opportunities that were out there that fit what I was looking to do.

While trying to figure out what it was, I wanted to do for a career, I really reflected on what my life goals were. Building my own home that was off grid in Northern New Hampshire is a goal and dream of mine. Since I have the actual building experience, I thought what was next? Electrical, I want to be an Electrician. Because my contacts at NHEP where able to point me to the right contact, I was able to find out about Revision Energy installing solar. I applied to their in-house apprenticeship program and after a few interviews I got the call that I got the job. I absolutely love what I do today, and I just came up on a year clean with my recovery! I making a life for me and my son and working towards a lifelong career as an Electrician. The future looks brighter than it's ever been today.





Bring Back the Trades

Awards one scholarship per month during the school year to an eligible student.

Cobb Hill Construction

Cobb Hill Construction is proud to offer scholarships to local high school graduating seniors who have demonstrated an interest in any of the following careers: drafting; construction; architecture; or electrical or civil engineering. Qualifying schools are Bow High School, Bishop Brady, Concord High School, Concord Christian Academy and Merrimack Valley High School.

The Hamel Construction Group Scholarship

The Hamel Construction Group Scholarship Fund was established through the generosity of J. Edward Hamel '61 CEO and founder of the Hamel Construction Group, Elkridge, MD. This fund provides scholarship support to University of New Hampshire undergraduate students enrolled in the Civil Engineering department. The annual award will be split equally, with one-half going to a senior and one-half going to a junior.

New Hampshire Good Roads

Each year, NHGRA sponsors the William Weaver Memorial Scholarship, awarded to University of New Hampshire students pursuing post secondary education in engineering and leading to a career in a highway related industry.

Plan NH

Plan NH's Scholarship and Fellowship Program, in partnership with the NH Charitable Foundation, recognizes and honors outstanding students who call New Hampshire home and who are studying a field that supports our mission: to "foster excellence in planning, design and/or development of New Hampshire's built environment."

Build You Future (BYF)

Scholarships are available for every interest. While a career in construction can be started with little to no debt, BYF has partnered with other organizations to further reduce barriers to training and education. These craft training scholarships are offered at various levels and for different interests.

The National Association of Women in Construction Scholarship

The NAWIC Founders' Scholarship Foundation (NFSF) assists in providing the construction industry with trained employees through higher education. Each year they award over \$100,000 to worthy recipients in construction-related programs. Award amounts range from \$500 to \$2,500. Some local chapters award scholarships as well.

Rock the Trades

This scholarship to assist learners pursuing an Associate's degree or vocational-technical certification in an Energy, Manufacturing, or Construction trade. Four people will be selected to receive a \$2,500 award for study at an accredited 2-year college or vocational-technical school.
