

The OSHA On-Site Consultation Program, WorkWISE NH, provides free, voluntary, and confidential workplace safety and health assistance to eligible small businesses in New Hampshire. Our program can help you identify potential safety and health issues that may arise within your workplace and assist you in developing systematic strategies to protect your employees from such risks. We can also assist you in identifying underlying factors that may have led to these hazards and educate you on the OSHA regulations behind them. Our program aims to aid you in safety and health education and give you the tools to "municate your risk control plans to other employees, management, and or stakeholders.

n-Site Consultation Programs, like WorkWISE NH, are separate from State and Federal OSHA
Consultants do not issue citations or penalties. However, employers requesting consultation
intend to correct serious hazards identified within agreed-upon time frames.

Work Commonly Used Statistics - OSHA

5,333 workers died on the job in 2019 (3.5 per 100,000 full-time equivalent workers) — on average, more than 100 a week or about 15 deaths every day. About 20% (1,061) of worker fatalities in private industry in calendar year 2019 were in construction – accounting for one in five worker deaths for the year.

The following were the top 10 most frequently cited standards by Federal OSHA in fiscal year 2020 (October 1, 2019, through September 30, 2020):

- 1. Fall Protection, construction (29 CFR 1926.501) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 2. Hazard Communication Standard, general industry (29 CFR 1910.1200) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 3. Respiratory Protection, general industry (29 CFR 1910.134) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 4. Scaffolding, general requirements, construction (29 CFR 1926.451) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 5. Ladders, construction (29 CFR 1926.1053) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 6. Control of Hazardous Energy (lockout/tagout), general industry (29 CFR 1910.147) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 7. Powered Industrial Trucks, general industry (29 CFR 1910.178) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 8. Fall Protection-Training Requirements, construction (29 CFR 1926.503) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 9. Eye and Face Protection, construction (29 CFR 1926.102) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
- 10. Machinery and Machine Guarding, general requirements (29 CFR 1910.212) [related OSHA Safety and Health Topics page]
